While we have lost a few vendors due to unforeseen circumstances, we have gained some new and exciting vendors and we are looking forward to a great season.

Here is a list of the vendors you can expect to find at the 2017 Farmers' Market. This list is incomplete as we are always receiving new applications and people's circumstances change over time.

Our farmers will include 19th Avenue Farm, Coopers CSA Farm, Howard's Farm, Nature's Rainbow, Oakridges Finest, Pioneer Brand Honey, Simpson Family Farm, Summerside Farm, Willowtree Farm, Pillitteri Estates Winery and a new cherry farm from the Niagara region.
